# EMMY BEAUTY COUNTDOWN

Glam slam! Pros tell *Us* how TV's A-listers are getting red carpet ready in L.A. for the September 16 show

## FACE

**Two weeks before** Celebs get a resurfacing facial like microdermabrasion to "improve skin color and texture," says Beverly Hills dermatologist Harold Lancer, whose clients include Emmy attendee and *Heroes* star **Ali Larter**.

**A week before** Stars plump up fine lines. *Ugly Betty* actress **Becki Newton** was set to go to Sonya Dakar for the UltraLuxe facial (\$295), which uses Syn-Ake, a synthetic snake venom ingredient, to relax skin. Best actress nominee **Kyra Sedgwick** is set for the 90-minute Collagen Facial (\$135) at Matty European Skincare & Cosmetics — it includes an enzyme peel and a firming gel.

**Days before** Makeup artist Brett Freedman is scheduled to shape best supporting actress nominee **Jenna Fischer's** arches. "I just clean up strays and trim for a pretty, natural look," he says.

## HAIR

**Three weeks before** Stars fine-tune their color. NYC colorist Rita Hazan added pale blonde highlights to best supporting actress nominee **Jaime Pressly's** golden hue. "She wanted a new look postbaby," Hazan says.

**A week before** Hair pro Adir Abergel, who will work with best actress nominee **Mary-Louise Parker**, advises clients to deep-condition hair to repair damage. Adds Hazan, "Get a clear gloss to add shine."

**Day of** Abergel tells clients to prep for styling with a clarifying shampoo. "It helps remove excess oil and residue," he says.

## BODY

**Two weeks before** Stars get firming treatments. To prepare for the red carpet, many get the Ona Slim, which uses dry brushing and massage to stimulate circulation to reduce water retention and bloating, claims L.A.'s Ona Spa director **Annie Morgenthaler**.

**Two days before** Celebs get spray tanning. "We do a scrub and airbrush tanning with body contouring to make them look trim and toned," says Morgenthaler.

**The day before** Stars get manicures and pedicures. The most in-demand colors for awards shows? "Nudes or a French mani-pedi. They match everything," says Morgenthaler.
